

Alarm Type	When do they occur?	What happens?	How do I Respond? Follow your hospital's procedure and:
Loose Tag	When the tag is too loose on the infant.	An alarm message appears in the Hugs software.	 Inspect the tag and make sure it is properly attached to the infant. Inform your System Administrator or Security. Check tags every hour and tighten as needed.
Exit	A baby wearing a Tag is removed from safe area without being signed out or discharged or is brought near a doorway when door is open without being signed out or discharged.	 An alarm message appears in the software. An alarm may sound. 	 Confirm whether the baby has been taken from safe area. Help locate the baby.
Tamper	The tag has been tampered with.	An alarm message appears in the software.An alarm may sound.	 Locate the baby and check Tag for tampering. Replace strap or Tag if necessary.
Improperly Applied Strap	The tag is not applied properly.	An alarm message appears in the software.An alarm may sound.	 Inspect strap and engage Tamper mechanism properly. Replace strap or Tag.
Strap Detached	When a Tamper or Improperly Applied Strap Alarm is cleared, but the tag is still in Tamper mode.	An alarm message appears in the software.An alarm may sound.	 Inspect strap and engage Tamper mechanism properly. Replace strap or Tag.
Auto Discharge	When a Tamper of Improperly Applied Strap Alarm is cleared, and the tag has gone into Strap Detached Alarm. If the strap has not engaged the Tag will auto discharge.	 An alarm message appears in the software. The tag will appear in the Census – Greyed Out! 	Replace the infant's tag as a new admission.
Supervision	Tag's Heartbeat has not been seen by software for a set time. System hardware is not being seen by network devices.	 An alarm message appears in the software. An alarm will sound. 	 Report the event to security. Provide notes for follow-up. Help locate the baby. Remove the Tag and set aside for evaluation.
Transport Time Expired	When a Tag has been gone from the system for longer than the Sign Out time.	 An alarm message appears in the software. An alarm may sound. 	 If the baby has been returned to the safe area, sign him/her in. If the baby has not been returned to the safe area, verify his/her location and then extend the Sign Out period.
Duplicate Tag ID	When the system detects a Tag with the same ID number as a Tag already admitted.	 An alarm message appears in the software. An alarm may sound. 	 Locate both babies. Discharge the Tag and remove the Tags from both babies. Attach a new Tag to both babies. Set aside the duplicate Tag and inform your System Administrator.
Low Battery	When the battery level becomes low.	An alarm message appears in the software.	 When the Tag is removed, separate it from Tags to be reused. Inform Security or your System Administrator.

^{*}Very rarely you may see an alarm for a system device, such as a Patient Security Receiver or Exciter. Contact your System Administrator or Security for guidance.
